
AANR West Region Non-Landed Club Outreach Program

Marginal growth due to events we host, social media presence, and some find us through AANR

We maintain at about 35, with new members evening out those who have left. Leaving accounts for 3 deaths last year and someone marrying a non-nudist, and 3 people moving. The bulletin and AANR website have always brought in new members. We typically get about 15-20 people at an event which is about all our homes can handle which is where the majority of our activities are. We also go out on

boats on the lake and visit landed clubs.

Our Club is closing after over 20 years on March 31st, 2025

Since my club just started last year, I don't have a lot to base the growth on. Our sister club also advertises our events and shares them on their mailing list.

We're holding steady at approx. 156 - 160 members between people dropping and people joining

Agreeing on appropriate behavior

Getting members to volunteer and host events. Managing growth issues.

1) That a few members put on most of the events. 2)We have an interview process with 4 to 6 membership committee members at a local restaurant happy hour or coffee shop to get acquainted before coming to our homes which has helped weed out inappropriate persons and set expectations ahead of time. We try to do this with everyone we invite into our homes. Early on I had talked w a man on the phone who was a member of AANR and thought he understood expectations. Without telling me, he brought two women I had not talked with and one of them touched a member inappropriately and later I found her going through a drawer in my bedroom after she asked if there was another bathroom she could use. It took a while, so I walked into my bedroom and that's where she was. Obviously they weren't invited back and I heard later he was let go from AANR yet was seen after that at a landed club allegedly because they liked him and hadn't had problems themselves.
